NATIONAL SCENARIO

- VET is a shared responsibility between the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Labour (and related bodies)
- Make it difficult to implement one single mechanism to be used by all different types of VET providers and include all variety of VET provision.

They have their quality certified according to the above-mentioned certification systems (depending on the VET provision offered) many have other quality management systems in place (ISO9001 being the most popular).


M&E TOOLS FOR GRADUATE TRACKING — SYSTEM LEVEL (PT)

- National EQAVET model requires data collection by the VET providers on the EQAVET indicators 5 and 6.
- Certification process run by DGERT includes a certification dimension "Results analysis, posttraining evaluation and continuous improvement" that points out for the need to VET providers to track graduate pathways after the end of the training.
- Monitoring developed within the scope of the ESF Operational Programs, but considered to be "fragmented and incomplete" (OECD, 2021).
- Some DGEEC Directorate-General for Education and Science Statistics studies/reports that follow the transition between secondary and higher education in a limited period of time **BUT** do not include the entire VET offer.
- IEFP being able to cross information with Social Security data (not following the complete graduate tracking).

- The national EQAVET model developed by ANQEP

 - REFERNET, coordinated in Portugal by DGERT

- Week development of a feedback loop logic




IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY

QUALIFICA CENTERS (QC) – WHY?

(State supported centers VNFIL / Accreditation of prior learning for adults)

- After analyzing the Portuguese Quality
 Assurance (QA) landscape, looking at the
 national VET scenario, the **Qualifica Centers (QC)** were chosen for the testing
 implementation (and for the training) of a
 VET Quality Network (QN) in Portugal.
- □ It will allow us to test, implement and sustain a long-term proposal of an informal network of providers with a specific location in the VET frame, answering to specific needs in terms of QA.
- This implementation of a Quality Network (QN) can allow Portugal to continuing developing a QN that brings added value to members and can be shared with different type of VET actors in the country.

- □ Currently, there are **319 QC** all around the country (because of that online training using Zoom platform was selected as the most efficient mode of learning and sharing).
- ☐ In the image it is possible to identify the number of QC in Portugal by region.




Figura 1. Modelo de Garantia da Qualidade dos Centros Qualifica

IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY - NEEDS ANALYSIS: IN THE FIELD

- Peer Review methodology (methodology that combines self-evaluation + external evaluation done by peers).
- The QCs do not use Peer Review methodology, and one of the main conclusions of the Focus Group made in Portugal was that peer review methodology needs to be acknowledged and used at a national level.

- QC 2022 Quality Charter central role of working in partnerships and cooperation, at local, regional level.
- The QC need to work more in cooperation – QN the answer?






