Partnership as a means of improving the quality of the regional vocational training system

- → significant role in improving public policies in vocational education and training and labour policies
- → multi-level governance approach
- → added value of dialogue between program management authorities, public institutions, economic, social and civil society partners
- → sharing best practices



What are the current challenges that this cooperation is facing?

- → to enhance employability
- → to promote social inclusion
- → to foster innovation by encouraging the development of new approaches and technologies to support learning
- → To ensure that individuals acquire the skills and knowledge needed to meet the demands of the labor market

- → Institutional level: planning of the European Social Fund (ESF+)
- → Requirement for access to public calls for proposals training projects
- → Accreditation VET providers: partnership as a prerequisite

Partnership and public calls for proposals

- → In order to submit training projects to obtain regional funding (i.e. ESF +) an accreditated VET provider must demonstrate a quality partnership consistent with the proposed training profile
- → Partnership among accredited training bodies, accredited labour agencies, associations, enterprises, social partners is mandatory.
- → Partnership is seen as an added value for vocational training activities and work services for citizens.

Evaluation criteria


- → Evaluation criteria for project eligibility:
 - consistency with the proposed professional figure
 - operational involvement of the partner in some phases of the project representing an added value in terms of concrete realization of the same
 - presence of institutional partnerships that guarantee a greater finalization of the initiative on the territory implementing links with production companies
 - number of partners involved

The regional accreditation model has several requirements:

- Structural Requirements

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- Economic-Financial Requirements
- Organization and Management
- Organization and leadership
- Policies and Strategies
- Human resources
- Customer Satisfaction
- Effectiveness and Efficiency
